THE CENTRE OF MORAY EMBRACEELGIN

Conveniently located in the centre of Moray, this former royal burgh is steeped in history and heritage from cathedrals to cashmere, there is something for everyone here.



Elgin's 'closes' are quirky and full of character. Discover their historic charm on your first day in Elgin or come back at night and listen to their stories on a guided tour with **Elgin Ghost Tours.** A trip to Elgin would not be complete without visiting the mighty 13th century **Elgin Cathedral** (pictured below). Once burned by the notorious 'Wolf of Badenoch' in the 14th century, see for yourself why it earned the name the 'Lantern of the North'. For lunch head into the centre of Elgin and choose from a selection of fine cafes and restaurants, which include the **Droughty Cobbler, Planta Cafe** or **19 Crepes & Coffee**.

It'd be a shame to come to Elgin and leave without sampling Moray's most famous export: Whisky. Every bottle tells a story at the 120-year-old **Glen Moray Distillery**, and with a selection of tours available it is a must visit. Nearby to Elgin is the wonderful **Benriach Distillery** which is also well worth a visit. Continue your whisky journey in the centre of Elgin with a visit to the 125 year old **Gordon & MacPhail.** Get some fresh air after your Whisky tastings with a peaceful stroll through the lovely **Cooper Park**, located in the centre of

Elgin Golf Course is one of the finest examples of inland golf courses that compliments a distillery tour.



Begin your final day in Elgin with a visit to Scotland's oldest independent museum, **Elgin Museum**. You'll certainly come away with a few exciting tales to tell from Elgin's past. Continue 10 minutes along the road from the museum to find more history at the **Moray Motor Museum**.
