While you're in the centre of Keith, spend time exploring some of its history and heritage. Head over to the **Auld Brig** (pictured) and gaze upon this 400-year-old stone bridge which spans the River Isla.

If outdoor activities is what you seek then be sure to check out **House of Mulben**, who offer archery, clay pigeon shooting, quad biking and more. Complete the day with a relaxing trip on the 'whisky line' by boarding the **Keith and Dufftown Heritage Railway**.
