Dubbed Moray's Riviera, Lossiemouth boasts not one, but two, stunning beaches and sits on a spectacular bit of coastline.

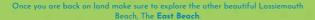

One of the new additions to Lossiemouth is **Windswept Brewing** where you can take tours, tastings and enjoy delicious pizza.

Begin your morning with a short history stop at Ramsay MacDonald's House, located on 17 Moray Street. Ramsay MacDonald was a British politician who served as the first Prime Minister of the UK. If you're looking for some adventure, book onto a boat trip organised by **North 58° Sea Adventures**. Leaving from Lossiemouth harbour, you'll be whisked away into the Moray Firth to start exploring the beautiful Moray coastline and its amazing







If you're interested in golf, you are in the right place. Firstly Lossiemouth is home to the beautiful links course **Moray Golf Club**, considered to be one of the finest golf courses in Scotland. The club

has two courses, one of which, aptly titled the Old Course was designed by Old Tom Morris and is a must for golfers. If you head down the coast you will also find the GDC Golf Dedication Centre and the little hidden gem of Covesea Links.
