TOMINTOUL

At 345 metres above sea level, Tomintoul is the highest town in the Highlands and sits within the spectacular Cairngorms National Park.



Get to know Tomintoul instantly with a visit to the **Tomintoul and Glenlivet Discovery Centre and Museum.** Learn the stories of the Excismen who hunted the illicit stillers of

Moray Speyside. Tomintoul and the surrounding area is one of the best places in Scotland to discover the wonders of the night sky, with the area having been designated a **Dark Sky Park**. After dark its worth getting out and gazing up at the night sky as the stars pass overhead. If you're lucky in the winter, you may even have a chance to spot

The snow roads that lead you to and from Tomintoul have many delights along the way and you can spend a whole day skiing or snowboarding at **The Lecht.**
