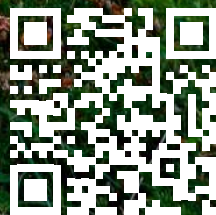

PLANE

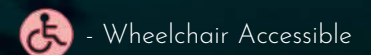
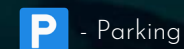
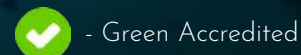
The nearest airport to Moray Speyside is just 30 minutes away at **Inverness Airport**. **Aberdeen Airport** to the east is around a 60 minute drive from Elgin.



CAR/BUS

If you plan to drive to Moray Speyside from either Edinburgh or Glasgow it takes just over 3 and half hours from both. The A9 is the best option in terms of time and it takes you through the stunning Cairngorms.

The megabus runs regularly from both Edinburgh and Glasgow.

MORAY'S ROYAL BURGH A TRIP TO FORRES

In the north-west of Moray stands the historical town with deep rooted royal associations. Originally home to the Picts and the real Macbeth, Forres is now a beautiful town perfect to holiday for a few days.

DAY 1



Start your trip to Forres with some of the best food and shopping you'll experience in Moray Speyside by driving the short distance to **Brodie Countryfare**. Here you will be greeted by a range of Scottish gifts and luxury country clothing. Just a stones throw away, you'll find the ancestral home of the Brodie Clan - **Brodie Castle**. Take a tour of the stunning castle and grounds and if you time your visit just right you might be able to attend one of the many spectacular events hosted at the castle such as Brodie Illuminated. Finish your day by eating at one of Moray's finest restaurants, **The Old Mill Inn**.

For a more adrenaline filled day head white water rafting down the Randolph's Leap (Pictured left) at Ace Adventures.

Remember to explore Forres in its entirety, as the town's rich history and stunning gardens are not to be missed. Forres has been crowned Britain in Bloom champion on five separate occasions due to the incredible work done by Forres in Bloom. Spend your morning walking around **Grant Park**, the sunken gardens and then take the walk up cluny hill to discover **Nelson's Tower** (Pictured below). A historic tour of Forres wouldn't be complete without stopping at Sueno Stone which is the tallest standing pictish stone in Scotland.

After a tiring walk try out **Bonnie Bestie** or **The Mosset Tavern** for great food.

DAY 2



Forres is the home to **Benromach Distillery** and a tour is essential on your trip. Have a taster after the tour or take a drivers pack which means you can visit Forres' little sister town Findhorn. Findhorn is home to the **Findhorn Foundation** where visitors are welcomed to take a walk around the site and pop into **The Phoenix Shop**. Findhorn is great for foodies and seafood lovers with **The Captain's Table**, **Kimberley Inn** and **Crown and Anchor** all offering tasty fresh food. Finish your trip to Findhorn with a walk on the beach or see the beach from another view with a boat trip from **North 58 Sea Adventures**.

For golf enthusiasts out there Forres Golf Course (Pictured below) will test the best golfers

MALT WHISKY COUNTRY

Moray Speyside is home to some of Scotland's most beautiful scenery. However, the region is better known for being the home of Malt Whisky, over half of all of Scotland's whisky distilleries can be found in Moray Speyside.

THE FRIENDLY TOWN EXPLORE KEITH

Rich in heritage and history, Keith – The first 'Scots Toun' is the eastern gateway to Moray Speyside. Step back in time and visit Keith.

Begin your visit to Keith with an exploration of Keith's flourishing **Mid Street**, packed with independent businesses, cafes, pubs and shops. It wouldn't be a trip to Scotland's first Scots Toun, a title given to Keith recognising the towns commitment to protecting and preserving the Scot's language, without popping into **Mither Tongue** (Scots for Mother Tongue) a fantastic small gift shop. While you're in the centre of Keith, spend time exploring some of its history and heritage. Head over to the **Auld Brig** (pictured) and gaze upon this 400-year-old stone bridge which spans the River Isla.

If you wish to stick to the whisky trail check out the historic **Strathisla distillery**.

There is plenty of excitement to have in and around Keith. If outdoor activities is what you seek then be sure to check out **House of Mulben**, who offer archery, clay pigeon shooting, quad biking and more. Complete the day with a relaxing trip on the 'whisky line' by boarding the **Keith and Dufftown Heritage Railway**.

If you are a foodie then Keith has lots to offer, why not try out the **Boogie Woogie Cafe** situated in the main square.

Where Rome was built on seven hills, Dufftown was built on seven stills. Fully immerse yourself in Dufftown, a haven for lovers of scotch.



DAY 1

With six working distilleries in the area you could easily spend a whole week here. The best place to start your scotch adventure would be with a trip to the well-known **Glenfiddich** and **Balvenie Distilleries**. Conveniently located a stones throw from each other, these two distilleries are among Speyside's most famous.

If you prefer gin check out **Glenrines Distillery**.

Start your second day in Dufftown with something a little bit different by visiting the **Dufftown Fairy Village**. Located just one mile south of Dufftown, you will be transported into a fairy tale setting befit of a Brothers Grimm novel. After this why not head to the real thing by visiting the impressive **Balvenie Castle**.

If you are seeking adventure why not head up **Ben Rinnes** and then refuel at the **Sidings Cafe** after a hard but rewarding trek.

DAY 1



Elgin's 'closes' are quirky and full of character. Discover their historic charm on your first day in Elgin or come back at night and listen to their stories on a guided tour with **Elgin Ghost Tours**. A trip to Elgin would not be complete without visiting the mighty 13th century **Elgin Cathedral** (pictured below). Once burned by the notorious 'Wolf of Badenoch' in the 14th century, see for yourself why it earned the name the 'Lantern of the North'. For lunch head into the centre of Elgin and choose from a selection of fine cafes and restaurants, which include the **Drouthy Cobbler**, **Planta Cafe** or **19 Crepes & Coffee**.

The Cashmere to Cathedral experience would not be complete without a trip to **Johnston's of Elgin** (pictured left)

It'd be a shame to come to Elgin and leave without sampling Moray's most famous export: Whisky. Every bottle tells a story at the 120-year-old **Glen**
